#### NEW INFO!

**Packing:** Our inter-island flight has a luggage limitation of **max 35 pounds TOTAL per person**, including ONE checked bag & a backpack or sachel/tote.

No second piece of “overhead” luggage is permitted. There is NO overhead on the one small flight we take.

Please pack lightly (it’s hot – so should be easy) one 35# bag. Buy a 4 pound bag (ditch that old heavy one!)

If this is an issue – you can put a light unconstructed duffel bag in the bottom of your luggage, and when we leave Quito on Day 7, you can leave some luggage behind (the duffel bag with what you do not need in the islands). We will be back in Quito – same hotel - for our last night – and you can retrieve it then. : )

**Diamox** - *It's kinda high there – will I be OK?* YIKES 9,350 feet. If you haven't been skiing – I would strongly suggest you get Diamox from your GP doctor. You take 2 pills daily for 2 or so days before the trip, and the first day you are there. No altitude sickness.

- **Accelerated Acclimatization:** *Diamox acts as a prophylactic to prevent and treat acute mountain sickness (AMS), reducing the severity of headaches, fatigue, and dizziness.*

**Will there be bottled water???** Yes, but please bring **a reusable bottle to refill** everywhere (save the environment : )  
Our beautiful planet is totally littered with plastic bottles and bags everywhere – please help.

**Currency:** US dollar

**Laundry:** Mid way thru the tour, we stay at Cally Hotel for 2 nights.

## Quito Altitude & Diamox

Quito, situated at approximately 9,350 feet, poses a risk for mild altitude sickness (soroche).

Acetazolamide (Diamox), a common, effective, and doctor-prescribed medication, can speed up acclimatization by increasing respiration. A typical dosage is twice daily, starting 24 - 48 hours before arrival.



## PASSPORT

Due to airline security measures, **your passport name must match your airline ticket name** or you may be denied boarding.

Your **passport's expiration date must be at least six months after your return** from your trip; if it is not, you should renew your passport.

**It is your responsibility to ensure the validity of all travel documents!** We recommend that you make copies of your important documents and papers (insurance cards, etc.). Leave a copy at home and have a copy with you. In the unfortunate situation that you lose your original documents, having copies facilitates the replacement process.

## Quito - Climate

Quito has a subtropical highland climate. The city has a fairly constant cool climate due to its elevation and proximity to the equator. The average temperature during the day is 66°F (19°C), which generally falls to an average of slightly below 50°F (10°C) at night. The average temperature annually is 64°F (18°C). There are only two obvious seasons in the city: dry and wet. The dry season (summer) runs from June to September, and the wet season (winter) is from October to May.

Today is a free day designed for acclimatization and relaxation. Quito sits at 2,850 meters (9,350 feet) above sea level, so this gentle start will help your body adapt comfortably.

You may choose to relax at the hotel, explore the surrounding neighborhood at your own pace, visit a nearby café, or take a light walk to enjoy your first deeper impressions of the city and the majestic Andes. The day is yours to enjoy as you wish.

There is a lot of Quito to explore.

You may choose to explore using the Double-Decker bus, or take a free walking tour. Or wander on your own thru Old Town exploring the charming streets filled with colonial buildings, cute cafes, and major landmarks like the presidential palace at Plaza Grande.

Ideas: Climb the Basilica towers, explore Indigenous art, taste Quito's signature snacks and sweets, visit Old Town landmarks, end with a traditional canelazo.

These sights we will be visiting on our last day in Ecuador - so skip these today:

- the Equator Line at Mitad del Mundo,
- a ride on the TeleferiQo cable car, offering panoramic views of the city and surrounding Andes.
- Middle of the World Monument (Mitad del Mundo)
- Intifran Museum, where science and folklore meet at the equator. Participate in fun, gravity-defying experiments and enjoy panoramic views.



### **Quito - The City**

Tucked between the green, misty peaks of the Andes and blessed with a warm, welcoming character, the lively city of Quito brings rich history together with modern energy. Those who visit will find everything from overflowing market stands and shamanistic healers to a nightlife that features, among other things, upscale clubs, charming lounges and salsa dancing.

History buffs will enjoy the Old Town, where the architectural influence of Spanish colonisation shows in the red-tiled roofs lining steep, cobblestoned streets. The area is a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site and visitors will relish seeing its ornate buildings and vibrant plazas. Bustling New Town has a more eclectic, business-oriented atmosphere, with its clubs, cafe-lined streets, hotels, offices and shopping centres. The diverse food scene features everything from local Ecuadorian dishes to international fare, and the area has a variety of art galleries and live music venues.

Quito is the cultural centre of the country and Indigenas make up a large proportion of the population. Evidence of their culture is all over the city, from the handicrafts displayed on street corners and ramshackle shops selling traditional everyday goods to the women in thick woollen clothing and felt hats queuing for bus tickets. The Quechuan language rings through streets and central plazas throughout the city.

The destination is rich in historical churches, monasteries and convents, many of which house religious paintings and sculptures dating back to the 16th century. There are also a few museums worth visiting in Quito. Among them, the Museo del Banco Central (beautiful pre-Colombian artifacts), the ethno-historical Museo Mindalae, and the contemporary art museum Museo Guayasamin stand out.



### Quito - Sightseeing

Set on the equator, yet surrounded by ice-capped volcanoes, the uniquely beautiful Quito dates back to Incan and perhaps even pre-Incan times. Little of that ancient history remains but the city's Spanish heritage is far clearer, with the best examples of colonial architecture including the 16th-century La Compañía de Jesús Church; the white homes of La Ronda, Quito's most picturesque colonial neighborhood; the St Francis Church and monastery, thought to be the oldest in South America; and the Plaza de la Independencia, which is lined with grand old buildings.

If travellers only visit one museum in Quito, they should make it the Museo del Banco Central, as the impressively housed modern institution is full to bursting with ancient cultural artifacts. Other worthwhile museums include the Museo Manuela Saenz, the Museo de la Ciudad, and the Guayasamin Museum. Quito is also home to some of Ecuador's best-loved natural wonders, and the best way to experience them is to take a ride on the Teleferico, a cable car that carries people from the base of Volcan Pichincha to the top of Cruz Loma. The views are breathtaking.

### Morning - Cotacachi Volcano & town

After an incredible breakfast [included], your journey begins with a scenic drive north **to Cuicocha Lagoon, a crater lake formed in the collapsed caldera of the Cotacachi Volcano**. The name Cotacachi has many meanings. In "Cara" it means "**lake with women breast**" which refers to the general shape of the island in Cuicocha lake; in Quichua it means powder salt.

**Later, visit the picturesque town of Cotacachi**, famed for its leather artisans. A short walk along its rim offers breathtaking views of the turquoise waters and surrounding peaks. Wander its quaint streets, browse handcrafted goods, and enjoy free time to shop.



### Afternoon - Peguche

Continue to the Peguche community, where you'll meet a local couple who will lead you through a spiritual and culinary experience: The Pambamesa, a traditional Andean meal shared communally as a symbol of unity and gratitude.



### Evening - at leisure

Tonight's accommodation is in a beautifully restored Andean hacienda, rich in character and surrounded by rolling hills.



### Check in at Hacienda Hosteria Chorlavi - 1 night stay

Hacienda Chorlavi is located in the province of Imbabura, 110 km from Quito, capital of Ecuador.

Legend has it that in these lands more than five centuries ago the great Inca Huaynacapac, met and fell in love with Princess Caranqui Pacha. On the Caranqui tongue Chorlavi means "Nest of Love" Chorlavi was the first property that the Jesuits bought in the region, in 1620. It was then acquired by the Tobar Family.

In 1971 the property was transformed into a hotel. Now we have 52 rooms, large gardens with centuries-old trees, large rooms for corporate or social events, Restaurant, Spa & Swimming Pool, Gym, Grilled Area, Mini Golf, and many other services and spaces that will delight the visitor with the aroma of the past.

Wireless internet access is provided in public areas.

A fireplace creates a cozy atmosphere.

Film lovers are sure to find just what they're looking for in the cinema's listings. There are a number of shops as well.

The grounds of the hotel feature a playground and a lovely garden.

Additional amenities include a TV room, a playroom and a library.

Further services and facilities include a 24-hour security service, medical assistance, a transfer service, room service, a laundry service, a coin-operated laundry and a hotel shuttle bus.

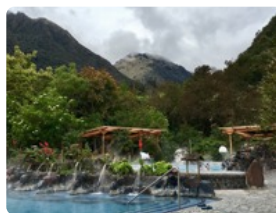

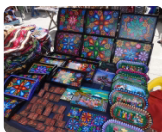

### Otavalo

Ecuador is famous for its colourful, indigenous markets, and the best known of these is the market at Otavalo. It dates back to pre-Incan times, when jungle products were brought up from the lowlands to be traded for highland goods. Every Saturday, visitors will find a wonderful sprawling mix of rich colour, smells, and the sounds of energetic bargaining, an essential part of trade and an art in itself. Spread over three plazas and the surrounding streets, thousands of local otavalenos in striking traditional dress sit among their wares, doing hard business with tourists and locals alike. The Plaza de los Ponchos is the main area for crafts such as woollen blankets, bright ponchos and jerseys, colourful bags and woven tapestries.

### Morning - Otavallo Market

The Otavallo Market, located in the Plaza de los Ponchos in Ecuador, is the largest indigenous market in South America, famous for textiles, alpaca clothing, and artisan crafts. It operates daily, but Saturday is the largest, most vibrant day. It is a must-visit, worthwhile experience for authentic, affordable handmade goods.

#### Key Aspects of the Otavallo Market:

- **Best Time to Visit:** The market is open daily (approx. 7:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.), but Saturday is the main market day with the widest selection and most vendors.
- **What to Buy:** Famous for alpaca wool blankets/ponchos, colorful, intricately designed textiles, hand-painted leather goods, jewelry, and traditional musical instruments.

Continue toward the Quitsato Solar Clock, a fascinating equatorial marker built with astronomical precision, a cultural monument built precisely on the equator line where you'll uncover Incan and pre-Incan knowledge of astronomy.



### Afternoon - Termas de Papallacta Hot Springs

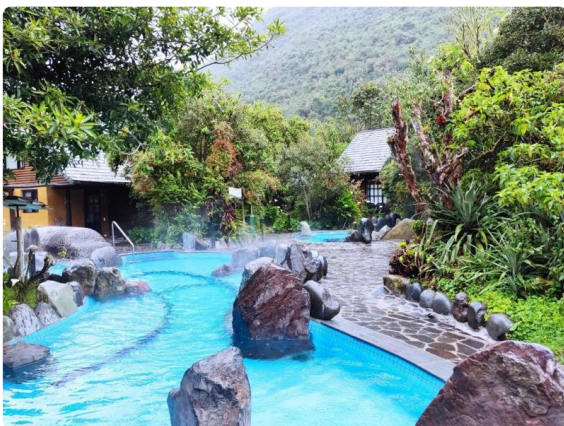
By the afternoon, you will arrive in Papallacta, famous for its therapeutic hot springs.

Termas de Papallacta is a renowned hot springs spa and resort located in the high Andes of Ecuador, roughly 1.5 hours from Quito. Situated at 3,250 meters near the Cayambe Coca Ecological Reserve, it features therapeutic volcanic pools, a full-service spa, on-site restaurant and the "Chacana Bar" , and hiking trails, offering a relaxing escape in a mountain-cloud forest setting.

The waters are heated naturally by the nearby volcanoes, providing, according to [Wikipedia](#), a rich mineral content beneficial for circulation and stress relief. Temperatures range from 36–38°C.

Situated in the Andean highlands, the resort provides dramatic views, Often surrounded by clouds, creating a unique "spa in the clouds" experience

Later, you will check in at your lodge, which also features its own smaller thermal pools on site, allowing you to continue enjoying the soothing hot springs in a more private and tranquil setting.



### Check in at Hosteria Pampallacta Termales - 1 night stay

Escape to the tranquil Hosteria Pampallacta, where you can savor a free breakfast of local cuisine and unwind in the garden. Unwind with a hike or bike ride, then soak up relaxation at one of the hotels smaller thermal pools on site, allowing you to continue enjoying the soothing hot springs in a more private and tranquil setting.

### From Papallacta to the Heart of the Amazon at Huasquila Lodge



### Check in **EARLY Huasquila Amazon Lodge - 1 night stay**

The Huasquila Lodge is a complex of bungalows located in the Sacred Valley of Cotundo in the Tena region.

The lodge works on reforesting formerly used pasture land to create a 20-hectare ecological corridor for local wildlife, such as monkeys and sloths.

"Inspired by a dream, we began reforesting former pasturelands. With the support of volunteers from around the world and the natural regeneration of the soil, we have successfully restored 110 hectares of forest. These, along with 60 hectares of primary forest, now make up the Huasquila Reserve. "

A restaurant on-site serves traditional Ecuadorian and international dishes, with meals included in the package.

**Activities Offered:** The lodge focuses on eco-tourism and adventure, offering:

- **Jungle Hikes:** Guided walks through the rainforest.
- **Waterfalls & Caves:** Visits to Huaysa Yaku, Latas waterfalls, and Jumandi caves.
- **Adventure:** Rafting and kayaking.
- **Cultural Experience:** Chocolate-making workshops and visits to local communities.

### **The Rainforest - Guided Hike ecological reserve**

After breakfast, descend along the eastern slopes of the Andes into the Amazon basin. As you enter the rainforest, you'll begin to notice dramatic changes in vegetation, climate, and biodiversity.

You'll arrive at Huasquila Amazon Lodge, set within a private ecological reserve. Your afternoon includes a guided nature hike through primary forest trails where your guide will introduce you to medicinal plants, unique ecosystems, and native wildlife.

Lunch will be at your Lodge.

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### Evening - Storytelling & Cannibal Lessons.

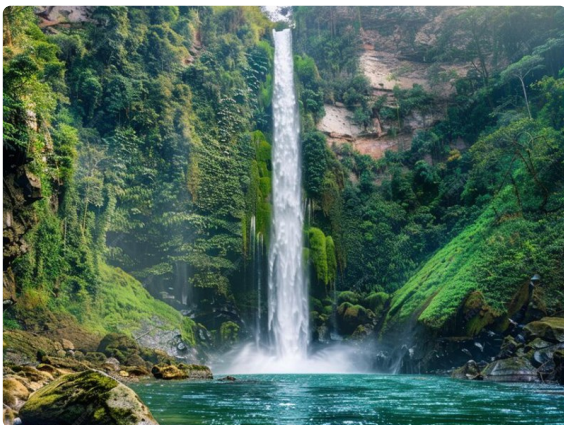

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### Exploring Baños' Natural Wonders and return to Quito



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### Morning - Devil's Cauldron; Manto de la Novia Double Waterfall by Cable Car

Head to the adventure capital of Ecuador: Baños de Agua Santa.

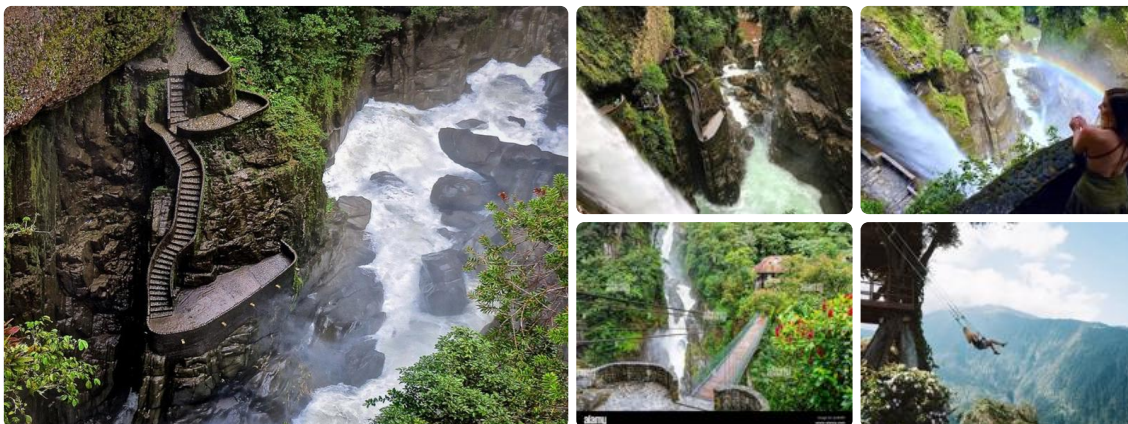
Nestled at the foot of the Tungurahua volcano, this vibrant town is known for its dramatic waterfalls and outdoor thrills.

We visit the spectacular **Pailon del Diablo waterfall** via a well-maintained, steep, and narrow trail, often wet from the intense mist, leading to balconies and a suspension bridge for dramatic, close-up views.

**Pailón del Diablo (Devil's Cauldron)** is a massive 80-meter (265-foot) waterfall near Baños, Ecuador, known as one of the country's most impressive, powerful cascades. Located on the Rio Pastaza, this tourist landmark features steep, carved stone stairs, a suspension bridge, and a narrow passage that allows visitors to get behind the roaring, misty falls.

Next, stop: **Manto de la Novia is a stunning double waterfall** located in the Pastaza canyon near Baños de Agua Santa, Ecuador, named for its resemblance to a white wedding veil. Famous for its 115-foot cascade, it is a key stop on the "Ruta de las Cascadas". Key attractions include riding the scenic cable car (tarabita) and hiking to the base for close-up views and refreshing mist.

Enjoy time to explore the town's shops and cafes or the famous Swing at the End of the World. The Swing at the End of the World is a famous, adrenaline-inducing attraction located at [La Casa del Arbol \(The Treehouse\)](#) in Baños, Ecuador. Hanging from a treehouse at 2,600 meters (8,500 feet) above sea level, the swing extends over a steep canyon, offering thrilling, panoramic views of the active Tungurahua Volcano.

### Galapagos Islands - The Region

Renowned for its unique biodiversity and pristine natural beauty, the volcanic Galapagos Archipelago is the second largest marine reserve in the world, comprising 13 major islands and six smaller ones. Its position between three ocean currents means visitors will find a unique climate, and many species that don't occur elsewhere. Photographers and nature enthusiasts will relish the experience.

As the Galapagos Islands are a popular holiday destination, the Ecuadorian government maintains strict control over tourist access to preserve the local ecosystem. A certified tour guide accompanies all visitors, and there are additional restrictions around tour-group size and activities in certain areas. Travellers should make bookings ahead of time.

On land, visitors can pass within inches of mating iguanas, walk between nesting frigate birds and watch thousands of brightly coloured Sally Lightfoot crabs scuttle across black volcanic rocks, among other things. In the sea, they can dive with sharks and turtles, and come face to face with penguins and sea lions. Flamingos, masked boobies, lava lizards and giant tortoises are also part of the wildlife population.

As for plant-life, the islands are volcanic and largely bare of vegetation, though they have some dramatic and strangely beautiful geological features. These include a 30-foot (10m) high cactus forest, exquisitely twisted lava flows, spatter cones and lava tunnels, bizarre rock formations, and red, black and white-sand beaches.

Puerto Ayora is the most developed town in the archipelago. Located on Santa Cruz Island, it's the centre of the Galapagos tourism industry. Most visitors either stay in this friendly little town while arranging a boat tour to the rest of the islands, or anchor in the harbour during their cruise.

The Transit Control Card (TCC or TCT) for the Galápagos Islands costs **US\$20 per person**, payable in cash at the INGALA counter in the Quito (UIO) airport before departure.

Your Guide will accompany you at the airport - and has your \$20 in US cash to be paid. So no worries.

**Each passenger will need to personally queue with their passport, as the Transit Control Card is issued individually.** This is a government requirement and cannot be processed as a group. Your guide will be there to support you and assist with the payment process, and supply your **\$20 cash per person prepared in advance**, as this will help make the process smoother.



### Arrival to Baltra Airport - Galapagos Park Fee

As of August 1, 2024, the Galápagos National Park entry fee for most international tourists (ages 12 and older) is **\$200 USD cash**.

**Credit cards are not accepted.**

**This is additional to your tour and not included, as all payments must be handled personally by each visitor.**

**Please bring \$200 in US cash, in clean, fresh un torn 20's, for the entrance fee.**

When you **arrive at Baltra Airport in the Galápagos**, each passenger will go through passport control and must **personally pay the Galápagos National Park entrance fee of \$200 per person in cash**. This payment is also individual and handled directly by each traveler during the arrival process.

From the Galapagos website:

*For some, this entry tax may seem a bit high, but it is important to keep in mind that these fees are helping to protect the wonderful islands. The Galapagos National Park announces that, "Funds from the entry tax for tourists are used to finance the conservation of biodiversity of flora and fauna, terrestrial and marine, and benefits the local community by improving basic services, education projects, sports, health, environmental sanitation, environmental services and services directly related to tourists."*

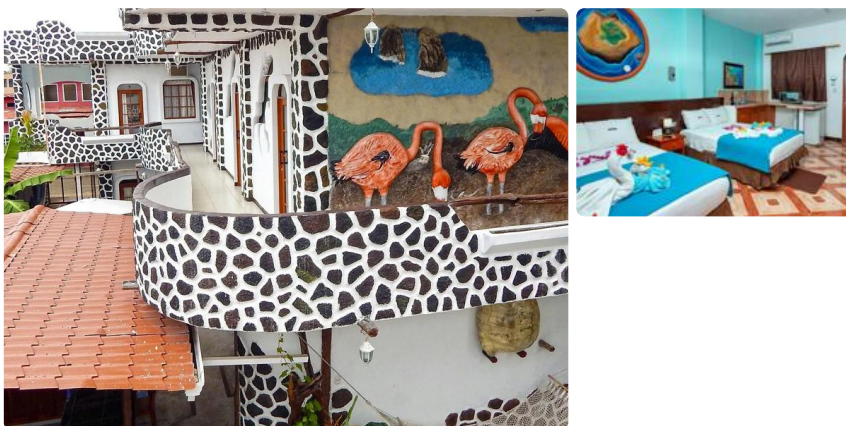

By visiting the islands, you are not only enjoying an outstanding and once in a lifetime holiday, but you are also contributing to the conservation efforts protecting the enchanting Galapagos Islands.*

### **Check in to Coloma Hotel, Santa Cruz Island - 1 night stay**

Hotel Coloma Galapagos Puerto Ayora is nestled only a 9-minute walk from Laguna las Ninfas. Located within reach of Visitor Center of Galapagos National Park, the hotel offers views of the courtyard and a swimming pool.

Known for a central location near the pier and fish market, it offers a pool, rooftop bar/lounge, and a complimentary breakfast.

A variety of restaurants and bars are 5 minutes away on foot,



### **Afternoon - Charles Darwin Research Station; Fausto Llerena Breeding Center**

**Visit the Charles Darwin Research Station**, the premier scientific facility operated by the [Charles Darwin Foundation](#) since 1964. It serves as a hub for conservation, research, and education to protect the archipelago's biodiversity, including a famous giant tortoise breeding center.

The station monitors invasive species, rehabilitates injured wildlife, and conducts marine research, including studying sharks, penguins, and flightless cormorants.

The station is operated with the help of numerous scientists, volunteers, and researchers, collaborating with the Galápagos National Park.

**Experience the Fausto Llerena Breeding Center**, where tortoises are raised in captivity and prepared for release back into the wild. It previously housed the famous "Lonesome George".

You will see exhibitions about the archipelago's, geography, geology, and species, along with a Tortoise Route boardwalk, a baby tortoise house, and land iguanas.

You'll see conservation in action and learn about the archipelago's delicate ecosystems and participate in a reforestation project **by planting a native tree**, directly contributing to ecosystem preservation.



## April 23 - Thu - Ferry to Isabela Island; Wetlands Exploration by Bike; Tintoreras

### Morning - Ferry; Isabela Entrance fee

Ferry to Isabella Island (2 hours) to the largest and most volcanic island in the archipelago.

Visitors to Isabela Island must pay a **\$10 USD dock fee** (cash) upon arrival at the Puerto Villamil pier. The process is simple.

**Your Guide will supply you with the \$10 cash dock fee - no worries.**

You will only need to queue up and pay the local island entrance tax directly in cash, and passports are not required at that moment.



### Afternoon - Tintoreras; Guided Bike Ride

**Upon arrival, explore Tintoreras Islet**, home to Galapagos penguins, sea lions, marine iguanas, and white-tipped reef sharks resting in lava crevices. Snorkel in shallow waters filled with tropical fish.

**Lunch will be provided.**

**Hop on a bike for a guided cycling tour** of the Wetlands Trail, stopping to observe flamingos and migratory birds at the lagoons.

Your final destination is the haunting Wall of Tears, a sobering reminder of the island's penal colony past. Enjoy beach time or a seaside walk in Puerto Villamil, a tranquil town with volcanic black sand beaches.



## Check in to Hotel Cally Isabela - 2 nights

Hotel Cally is located near the Puerto Villamil center, just a few minutes walk from the beach, the pier, and the town center park where you can find various stores and restaurants.

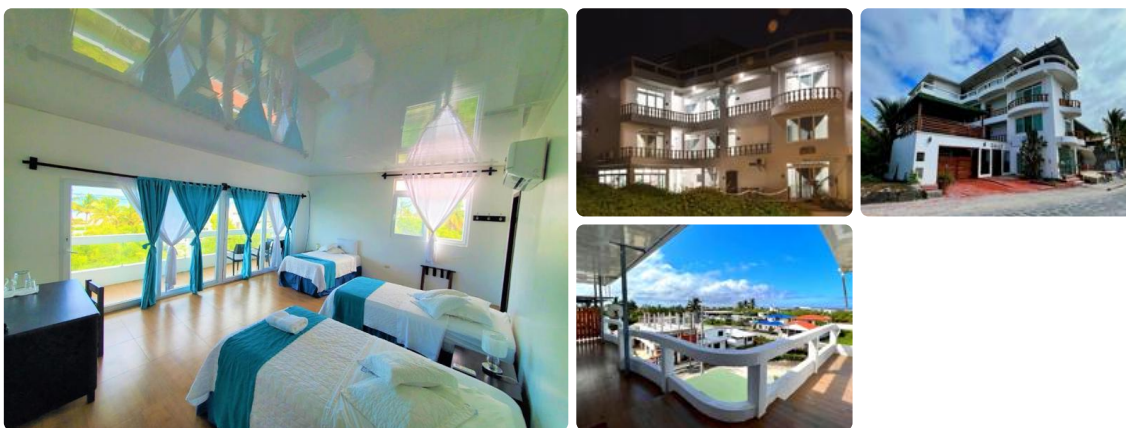

### Morning - Snorkel Los Tuneles

Enjoy a guided snorkeling excursion at Los Tuneles, one of the most unique sites in the Galapagos, shaped by ancient lava formations.

Los Tuneles (Cabo Rosa) on Isabela Island features a unique, surreal landscape of collapsed volcanic lava bridges and tunnels over crystal-clear, shallow, and calm water. It is renowned as a premier, top-tier snorkeling spot where visitors can easily swim alongside Galapagos penguins, sea turtles and rays.

### Key Reasons Why Los Tuneles is Special:

- **Surreal Geological Formations:** Thousands of years ago, lava flows solidified on the water's surface, creating a maze of underwater arches, tunnels, and bridges that are now partially collapsed.
- **Top-Tier Snorkeling:** The calm, shallow, and transparent water makes it one of the safest and most spectacular places to snorkel in the Galapagos.
- **Abundant Marine Wildlife:** It is a hotspot for spotting Green Sea Turtles, White-tip reef sharks, Galapagos penguins, golden rays, seahorses, sea lions, and eagle rays.

- **Unique Bird Spotting:** The area is a breeding site for blue-footed boobies, which can often be seen nesting on the lava arches.

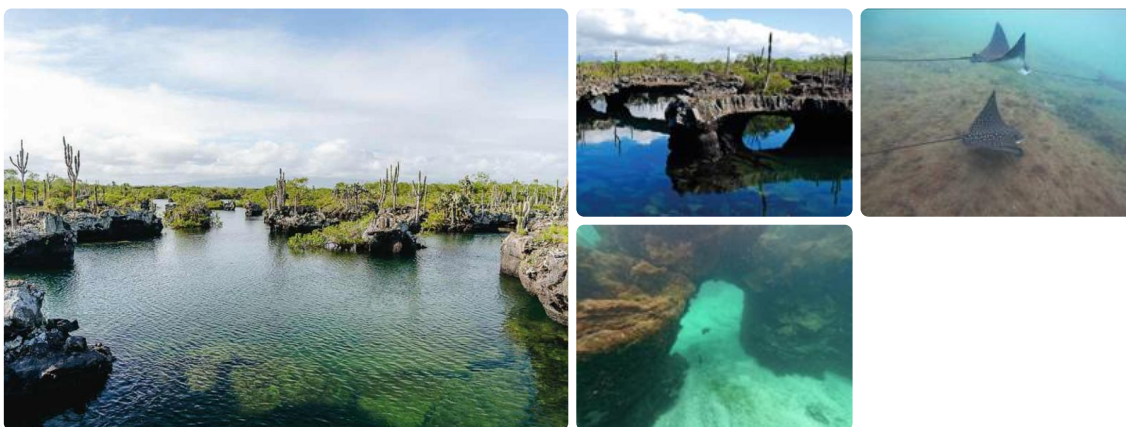
The only way to experience this location is via a guided boat tour from Puerto Villamil on Isabela Island, typically lasting 5 to 6 hours.

Los Tuneles Galapagos is the ultimate hangout spot for a wide diversity of marine life. But, why is this particular area of Isabela so rich in wildlife?

1. **Shelter and Habitat:** The intricate network of tunnels, arches, nooks, and crannies provide the perfect hiding spots and safe havens for marine creatures, protecting them from predators and strong currents.
2. **Rich Feeding Grounds:** Algae, plankton, and other small organisms flourish here, providing a buffet for the marine creatures that feed on them.
3. **Breeding Grounds:** Many marine species use Los Tuneles as a breeding and nursery area. These calm, protected waters are perfect for raising young.
4. **Healthy Coral and Marine Plants:** The clear, clean waters and volcanic substrate at Los Tuneles provide an excellent environment for coral growth and marine plants. These form the foundation of the food chain and attract a variety of fish and other marine organisms.

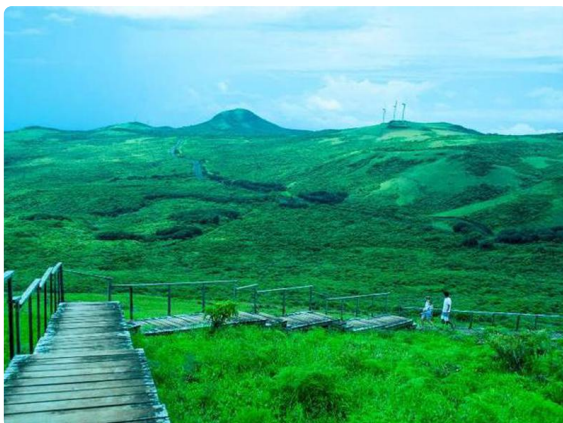

### Isabela Island/Tintoreras and flight to San Cristobel



### Morning - Tintoreras

Enjoy a half-day excursion to Tintoreras, a stunning islet known for its lava formations and rich wildlife, including marine iguanas, sea lions, and reef sharks.

Tintoreras is a small group of volcanic islets off the coast of Isabela Island in the Galápagos, famous for offering a "metaphorical snapshot" of the archipelago's charm in a compact, accessible area. It is particularly special because iconic wildlife can be seen up close, often without even getting into the water. It is one of the most accessible and biodiverse sites in the archipelago.

After the excursion, return to Isabela Island to prepare for your flight to San Cristobal.

Explore local shops, relax on nearby beaches, or visit the La Loberia trail.

- **Accessible Wildlife:** Sea lions, blue-footed boobies, marine iguanas, and tortoises are easily found, often within the town of Puerto Baquerizo Moreno.
- **Historical Significance:** It is home to the oldest permanent settlement in the archipelago and was the first island visited by Charles Darwin in 1835.
- **Unique Geography & Water:** Unlike many other islands, it features the freshwater lake **El Junco** in its highlands. It is formed by several extinct volcanoes, offering diverse, lush, and hilly terrain.
- **Key Visitor Sites:** Highlights include [Kicker Rock](#) (a towering, split rock formation), Punta Pitt (nesting site for all three types of boobies), and the [Interpretation Center](#).

Unlike other excursions with multiple short stops, this tour is designed to give you more time in fewer, unforgettable places — where the real magic of the Galápagos unfolds.

Swim alongside colorful fish, rays, sea turtles, and even sharks in crystal-clear waters. The area's marine life and underwater scenery make it an unforgettable experience. Return to San Cristóbal for the evening.

### El Mitad del Mundo

El Mitad del Mundo (The Middle of the World) is a purpose-built complex of museums and shops that was constructed to mark the equator, the line that gives the country its name. The 96-foot (30m) high Equator Monument is the focus of the square, and is topped by a brass sphere representing the world. A painted line stretches out on either side of the monument marking the equator that divides the world, and the complex into northern and southern hemispheres. A set of weighting scales also lie on the square and illustrate the fact that visitors lose a bit of weight at the equator, as they're subject to a lesser force of gravitational attraction than usual.
