PASSPORT

Due to airline security measures, **your passport name must match your airline ticket name** or you may be denied boarding.

Your **passport's expiration date must be at least six months after your return** from your trip; if it is not, you should renew your passport.

It is your responsibility to ensure the validity of all travel documents! We recommend that you make copies of your important documents and papers (insurance cards, etc.). Leave a copy at home and have a copy with you. In the unfortunate situation that you lose your original documents, having copies facilitates the replacement process.



ELECTRICITY

Europe's electrical system is different from ours in two ways: the voltage of the current and the shape of the plug. American appliances run on **110 volts**, while European appliances are **220 volts**.

You will need a standard European 2-prong plug adapter.

Most phones and cameras have a built in converter but you may need an adaptor to charge them. If bringing any other accessories that require electricity, you may need a converter. You can read more about converters and adapters [here](#).



CURRENCY

ATMs, DEBIT CARDS, AND CREDIT CARDS

While travelling in Europe, we recommend using your debit card and withdrawing cash at ATMs in the local currency for your transactions abroad. It is the easiest and most cost-effective method. Upon arrival at a European airport, it is a good idea to withdraw cash from an ATM so that you have some on hand for train/taxi travel to your destination but from then on, it is best to use ATM machines at a local bank, which will have lower fees.

Helpful tips:

- Contact your bank to let them know that you will be travelling internationally.

- - Ask your bank what the fees will be for an ATM cash withdrawal
 - Inquire about your daily withdrawal limit and consider increasing it
 - Know your 4-digit PIN
 - Ask your bank what the fees will be if you use your debit card for purchases (this will typically include fees from both the bank and the creditor on the front of your card)
- Stick with actual bank ATMs. There are independent ATMs that are tricky and charge higher fees, and are sometimes located right next to banks as well. (Examples of independent ATMs to avoid are Travelex, Euronet, Moneybox, Cardpoint, Cash Zone).
- Know the symbols on the front and back of your debit card
- - Symbols on the back are for ATM cash withdrawals, they represent the cash networks used (VISA Plus, MasterCard Maestro or Cirrus)
 - Symbols on the front are for purchases – work like a credit card and typically include higher fees (VISA, MasterCard)
- Be aware of ATMs that give you a message sounding like they are doing you a favor by asking if you'd like them to convert the transaction for your bank into your home currency – you don't want to do this, you will end up paying a lot more in fees but they don't tell you. Always choose the currency of the country you are in and have your home bank do the conversion.
- ATMs are also referred to as "Cash Point" in the UK, "Distributeur" in France, and "Bankomat" elsewhere.
- You may also wish to use your credit card but be sure to know what fees will be included.

The journey begins in Sachsenhausen, one of Frankfurt's most atmospheric neighborhoods. Known for its Gründerzeit architecture, cozy cafés, cider taverns, and vibrant local life, Sachsenhausen was once dominated by orchards and apple cider production—a tradition still alive today. Your guide will introduce you to the district's character and its historical charm before setting off.

From here, you'll cycle through narrow lanes and the charming painters' quarter to reach the Museum Embankment on the south bank of the Main River. This cultural hotspot is home to some of Germany's most celebrated museums, including the Städel Museum, the Liebighaus, and the Museum of Applied Art—all nestled along one of the city's most scenic stretches of riverfront.

Cross the Holbeinsteg pedestrian bridge and glide into Frankfurt's historic Old Town, where the past comes to life. Discover the medieval Römer, the city's iconic town hall, and follow the ancient royal route past Frankfurt Cathedral and a beautiful square of restored half-timbered houses. A short ride brings you to St. Paul's Church, the birthplace of German democracy, and the nearby Goethe House, where Germany's greatest writer spent his youth.

The tour continues along the Wallanlagen, a peaceful green belt built on Frankfurt's former medieval fortifications. Here, traffic-free paths lead you through the heart of the city. See the Old Opera House, the elegant Neue Oper, and enjoy panoramic views of Frankfurt's high-rise skyline. A quick detour brings you to the Frankfurt Stock Exchange, home to the famous bull and bear statues.

Heading east, you'll follow the Main once more toward Frankfurt's bold new icon—the European Central Bank Tower, which rises above the former wholesale market hall. At its foot lies the popular Oosten bar, a riverside spot with a spacious terrace and stunning views of the city.

After crossing the striking East Harbor Bridge, you'll return to Sachsenhausen, where the tour ends just steps from traditional cider taverns. Your guide will be happy to share recommendations so you can enjoy an authentic local meal and toast the day with a glass of Apfelwein.

About Oktoberfest:

The Frankfurt Oktoberfest is much smaller than its more famous Munich extravaganza. But Frankfurt's festival is known for having several tents with beer, food, and music, often focusing on a *more local and regional feel* than the large-scale Munich event.

The Oktoberfest in Frankfurt takes place at Deutsche Bank Park, a stadium located in the heart of Frankfurt. This area is known for its vibrant atmosphere and iconic landmarks such as the Frankfurt skyline and the Main River.

Entry to Oktoberfest is FREE! You can stroll into the venue and its tents without needing to buy a ticket or reservations at all. However - advance purchased tickets for a table/seat are highly encouraged - as "free" seating is very limited.

Marksburg Castle with guided tour 12:30 - 1:30

Perched high above the town of Braubach, Germany, Marksburg Castle is a towering medieval fortress.

Remarkably, it is the only hilltop castle on the Middle Rhine that has never been destroyed or conquered in over 700 years. It is a main site of the Rhine Gorge UNESCO World Heritage Site.

History & Facts

- **Origins:** The oldest part of the fortress dates to around 1100, originally built by the Lords of Eppstein to oversee river traffic and collect customs duties.
- **The "Unconquered":** Unlike many other Rhine castles that were ruined by warring factions or the Thirty Years' War, Marksburg's formidable defensive ramparts and outworks discouraged enemies from attacking.
- **Preservation:** The castle has been the headquarters for the [German Castles Association](#) (Deutsche Burgenvereinigung) since 1900, which has lovingly maintained and preserved its medieval character.

Private Guided Tour

The interior can only be explored via guided tours. The tour includes the medieval wine cellar, the castle kitchen, the Great Battery (which still houses historic cannons overlooking the Rhine), and an armory displaying the evolution of medieval armor. There is also a famous medieval herb garden on the grounds.

The history of this region goes back to the Roman Era, some 2.000 years ago. Beautiful timbered houses, vineyards, the Porta Nigra in Trier, the "German corner" (conjunction of Moselle and Rhine) in Koblenz and Saarburg (also known as "little Venice") are only a few of the highlights during this trip.

The Moselle, with a length of 544 km, is the Rhine's longest tributary and it is also the second most important shipping route in Germany.

The Saar, which has the greatest abundance of water and a length of 246 km, is the Moselle's longest tributary.

The quality of the cycle paths along this route is excellent.

Most of the path along the Moselle is paved or asphalted and does not have any gradients of note.

After breakfast, you will cycle from Cochen to Beilstein, one of the best preserved historical villages along the length of the Moselle. Towering above the village, which you will have the opportunity to explore, are the ruins of Castle Metternich.

After leaving Beilstein you will pass Europe's steepest vineyard – with slopes between 50 and 55 degrees – at Bremmer Calmont.

Today's tour ends in the wine village of Zell on the Moselle, well known in the wine industry for the wine "Zeller Schwarze Katz".

In Zell, you should use the opportunity to get to know the good wines of the Mosel (optional, not included).

The grand half-timbered houses that surround Bernkastel-Kues's market place date back to the Middle Ages and are a photographer's delight.

You will reach the ship in Kues after a tour through town.

You will cycle from Mehring via **Pfalzel** to **Trier**, where the ship is waiting for you in the afternoon.

Trier is undoubtedly the historic highlight of the tour.

A walk through the 16 B.C. founded Trier is an overwhelming journey through the millennia, with no other place in Germany able to give you a better chance to experience the time of the Romans.
