YOU NEED TO HAVE COMPLETED 3 THINGS TO ENTER BALI



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1. E-Visa: You need an **Electronic Visa (e-VOA)**, or a Visa on Arrival (VOA) [done at the airport upon arrival - DO NOT do this] which costs IDR 500,000 (~\$35 USD) and lasts 30 days. Apply in advance on the Official Indonesian eVisa Website <https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id/>

This lets you use the Autogates at the airport, saving you from long manual immigration lines.

ONLY use this website – there are a lot of 3rd party places that are not official.

Proof of Onward Travel: Immigration officers strictly require a return or onward ticket proving you will leave Indonesia. Have your *printed* flight schedule in your travel folder.

Passport Validity: Your passport **must** be valid for at least **6 months** from your date of arrival. Indonesia is strict about this; airlines may deny boarding if you have less time or if your passport is even slightly damaged (e.g., a torn page or peeling laminate).

2. Tourist Levy: All international visitors must pay a mandatory **IDR 150,000 (~\$10 USD) tourism fee**. It is highly recommended to pay this prior to arrival via the Love Bali Portal <https://lovebali.baliprov.go.id/> to save the confirmation QR code on your phone (do a Screenshot!). You will need your Visa number (above), so do second.

3. Customs Health Declaration. FREE. This can only do this 3-days before you arrive. Do this the night before you fly!

Must be completed online up to 72 hours before you arrive, which generates a QR code (do a Screenshot for your phone!) to be officially scanned upon arrival.

💰 Bali Currency & Money

Currency: Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). Pron: roo·pee·uh

Exchange Rate: Currently, \$1 USD is approximately **IDR 16,800**. A quick way to "mental math" this is to think of IDR 100,000 as roughly \$6 USD.

Cash vs. Card: While major hotels and restaurants in tourist hubs (Seminyak, Canggu, Ubud) accept credit cards, **Bali is still very much a cash society for local markets, small "warungs" (eateries), and transport. Bring at least 1 ATM card.**

ATM Safety: Only use ATMs located inside bank branches or well-lit malls. "Skimming" can be an issue at isolated street-side ATMs.

⚡ Electricity

Plug Type: Bali uses **Type C** and **Type F** (the two-prong round European style).

Voltage: 230V / 50Hz.

Note: If you're coming from North America (110V), ensure your devices (like curling iron) are "dual voltage." Most phone and laptop chargers are already dual voltage (check for "Input: 100-240V").

💡 Pro-Tips for the Island

The Water: Best to **not** drink the tap water. Most people do not have any issue with brushing your teeth with tap water, and such... but if you have a sensitive stomach, use bottled or filtered water even for brushing your teeth ("Bali Belly" is a real vacation-ruiner).

Transportation Download the **Grab** or **Gojek** apps. They are the "Uber" of SE Asia and offer fair, fixed pricing for cars and motorbikes. You can enter a credit card into the app (like Uber/Lift) and it is very convenient for getting around, and cheap!

International Driving Permit (IDP): If you plan to rent a scooter, (NOT a good idea) you **must** have an IDP from your home country. Without it, your travel insurance is likely void if you have an accident. You can get one at any AAA, and you do not need to be a AAA member.

Bali - Getting Around

Bali can be a challenge to navigate, as the aging infrastructure struggles to support rapid development. Road rules are practically non-existent, and traffic can be chaotic with frequent jams in Ubud, Denpasar and other major centres. Renting a motorbike is an adventurous way to see the island, but is a very BAD idea and not recommended. Cars are available for hire with a driver, which can be the most stress-free way to get around.

Travellers can arrange transport through ride apps (Grab, BlueBird etc), but drivers are sometimes not allowed to collect them in certain areas, such as temples or some beaches.



Bali - Climate of 2 seasons

Lying just south of the equator, Bali has a tropical monsoon climate with two distinct seasons: wet (November to March) and dry (April to October).

Bali, and in fact the whole Indonesian archipelago, experiences only slight temperature variations from season to season due to the warm ocean currents that keep heat fairly constant on land.

There is also very little variation in daylight hours from season to season.

The dry season has hotter temperatures, but the humidity levels are much higher during the wet rainy season.

The height of the summer season also brings cool breezes to temper the hot weather. Temperatures are cooler in the mountainous areas and it is less humid.

The average annual temperature is about 86F (30C).

It is generally better to travel to Indonesia in the dry season between April and October. May, June and July are generally considered the best months to visit Bali.



Bali - The Region

Long recognized as an exotic paradise, the island of Bali is a picturesque vision of green rice fields and plantations, soaring volcanoes, cool lakes, rushing rivers, lush forests and palm-fringed beaches. It is Indonesia's number one tourist spot and it is not difficult to understand why, with its incredible coastline and the charm of its smiling people, especially in the many small rural villages and fascinating places of the fertile interior.

What sets Bali apart from the rest of Indonesia is the prevalence of Balinese Hinduism. Scattered around Bali are thousands of Hindu temples and places of worship. The island's religious beliefs are evident in the ceremonies, daily rituals and attitudes of the locals, in the offerings of flowers and food that adorn the roadsides, the charms hung inside taxis, and the numerous vibrant festivals that occur throughout the year.

It is also perceptible in local reverence for the Holy Mountain, the soaring volcanic cone of Gunung Agung, which is the spiritual center of the Balinese universe.

Art is an integral part of daily life and every village has its artists, from internationally acclaimed painters to aspirational young cow herders.

Ubud, the cultural center, with its streets lined with art and crafts shops, also offers regular performances of traditional Balinese dance and music.

Art, together with tourism, is an important source of revenue for the island.

With its fine beach, the popular resort of Kuta is the most visited destination. Located just a short drive from the airport in southern Bali, it is blessed with a lovely sweep of golden sand, crashing surf and spectacular sunsets.

Visitors will find a range of tourist trappings along with the natural attractions, including shops, hotels, excellent restaurants and an energetic nightlife.

Our last night will be spent on the beach in Kuta.

Bali is a tropical paradise with a rich and intriguing culture, and beautiful land and seascapes. Travelers will find it an idyllic holiday destination.

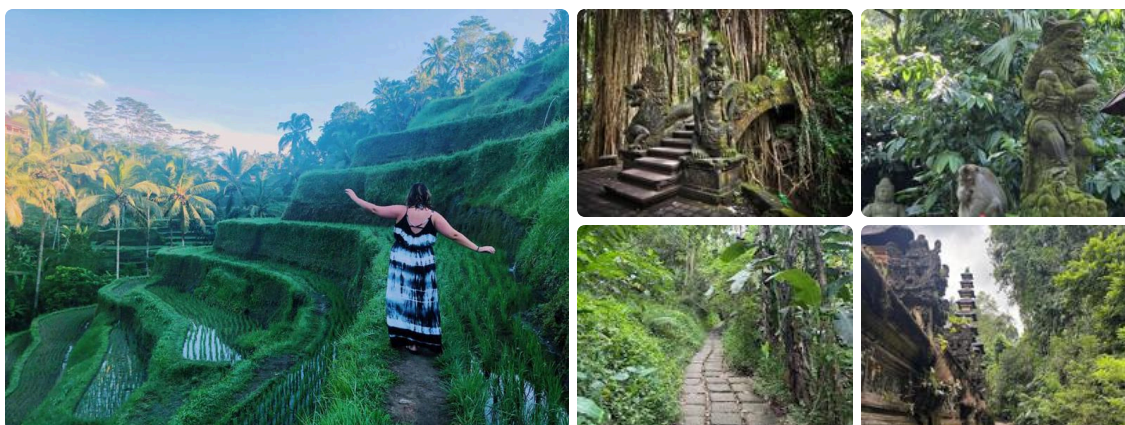

Where to see a traditional Gamelan Concert

Gamelan concerts in Ubud are best experienced through nightly performances at [Ubud Palace](#) (Puri Saren Agung) or the water temple [Pura Taman Saraswati](#).

Top-tier traditional Gamelan Semara Ratih performs Saturday nights at [Pura Dalem](#), while children's gamelan groups often play at the Water Palace.

- *Ubud Palace (Puri Saren)* – Nightly gamelan and Legong shows in a royal courtyard
- *ARMA Museum & Neka Museum* – Cultural nights with live orchestras
- *Pura Dalem Ubud & Batubulan Village* – Famous for Barong & Keris performances



Where to see a Kecak Fire Dance Show in Ubud

The best places to see a Kecak fire dance show in Ubud are in temple courtyards and cultural centers, usually starting around 7:00 PM.

Top venues include **Pura Dalem Taman Kaja** (Monday/Wednesday), **Peliatan Palace** (Thursday), and **ARMA Museum**. Shows typically cost IDR 80,000–150,000 and offer an intimate, local experience.

Tips for Attending:

- **Book Ahead:** For popular shows like Pura Dalem Taman Kaja, booking in advance is recommended.

- **Arrive Early:** Get to the venue 30–60 minutes early to secure good seats, particularly for smaller venues, say the reviews on [Tripadvisor](#) and [GetYourGuide](#).
- **What to Expect:** Shows are usually 60–90 minutes long, focusing on the Hindu epic Ramayana with vocal chants and fire rituals. Klook Travel +4

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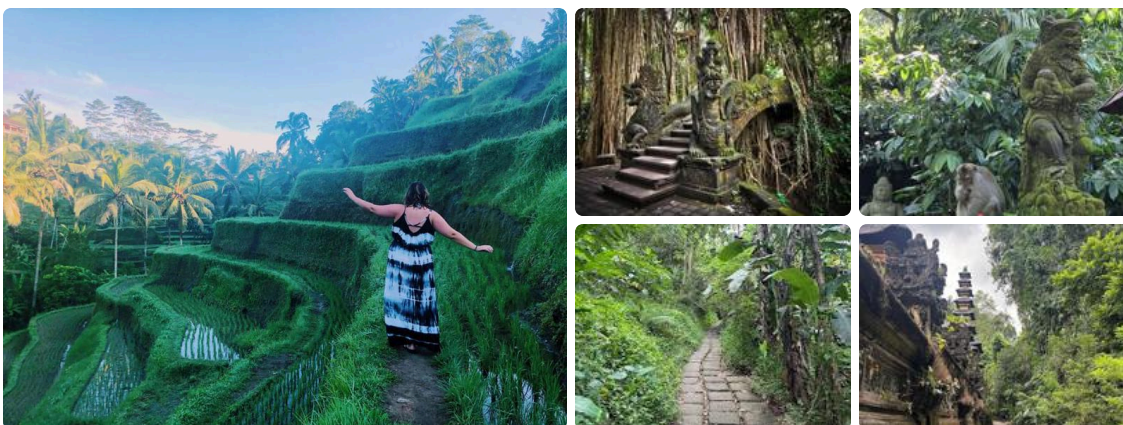

Sangek Monkey Temple & Forest

The Sangeh Monkey Forest and Temple—officially known as Alas Pala—is a historic sanctuary located in central Bali. Established during the Dutch colonial era in 1919, it spans 14 hectares of towering, homogeneous nutmeg trees.

The Temple of Pura Bukit Sari

The centerpiece of the forest is **Pura Bukit Sari**, a moss-covered Hindu temple built in the 17th century. The temple was built to honor the God of Prosperity (Vishnu) and serves as a place of prayer. It remains an active place of worship where local Balinese villagers still come to perform traditional ceremonies

The Sacred Macaques

The forest is inhabited by over 600 long-tailed macaques. Local Balinese folklore views these monkeys not as mere animals, but as the sacred reincarnations of princess warriors. Because of this belief, the monkeys are highly respected by the local community and are considered the spiritual guardians of the forest and the Pura Bukit Sari temple

- **Tip:** Secure your belongings (glasses, bags, jewelry) as monkeys are playful and curious.



Banyumala Waterfalls

Banyumala Twin Waterfalls is a stunning, secluded natural attraction in North Bali, tucked into the lush, mountainous caldera near Wanagiri. Famous for its dramatic twin cascades tumbling over mossy cliffs into a clear, swimmable pool, it offers a serene jungle escape and excellent photography opportunities

The Trail: The path is well-maintained but consists of a mix of dirt trails, bamboo stairs, and concrete paths. It can get slick, so proper walking/hiking shoes are highly recommended.

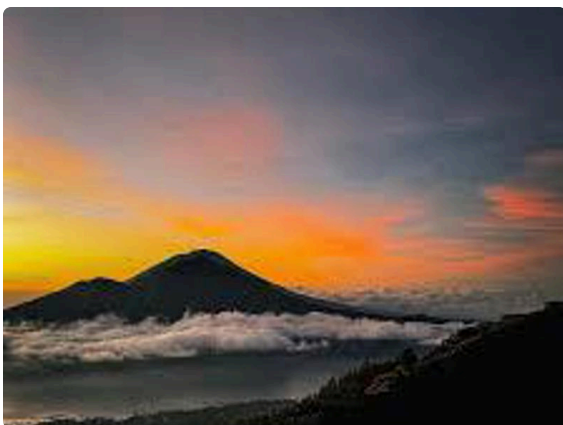


Mount Batur (Kintamani)

Mount Batur is an active volcano in Kintamani, Bali, famous for its 1,717-meter (5,633 ft) summit sunrise trekking, offering breathtaking views of Lake Batur. It last erupted in 2000, leaving behind a vast caldera. The 2-hour hike is considered moderate.

Wear layers, as it is cold and windy at the top, and bring sneakers.

We will not be hiking the volcano. This stop is only to enjoy the panoramic view of Mount Batur and Lake Batur from the viewpoint. You will have time to take photos, relax, and enjoy the scenery.



Ulun Danu Bratan Temple

Ulun Danu Bratan Temple, or *Pura Ulun Danu Beratan*, is one of Bali's most iconic water temples. Built in 1633, the stunning sanctuary seems to float on the misty, reflective surface of Lake Bratan. Located in the cool Bedugul highlands, it is a sacred site dedicated to Dewi Danu, the goddess of water, lakes, and rivers.

Built in 1633 by I Gusti Agung Putu, the King of Mengwi, to worship the Hindu Trinity (Brahma, Vishnu, and Shiva) alongside the local water goddess.

Along with Hindu shrines, the complex contains a shrine specifically dedicated to Buddha, demonstrating the harmony and inclusive nature of Balinese faith.

Tegallalang Rice Terrace

Tegallalang Rice Terrace is a world-famous, UNESCO-recognized cultural heritage site in Bali. It showcases iconic, emerald-green terraced hillsides carved into a lush valley.

It is powered by *Subak*, a traditional cooperative irrigation system dating back to the 8th century. A centuries-old, cooperative water management system that honors harmony with nature and ensures fair water distribution among local farmers.

A network of narrow, winding dirt paths and bamboo bridges takes you deep into the valley. The full trek takes about 30 to 60 minutes, depending on your pace.

Important: Bring small cash! Card payments are not accepted, and local farmers along the paths may ask for small donations (around Rp 10,000–20,000) to cross specific bridges or enter certain plots.



Uma Pakel Coffee Plantation

Uma Pakel Agro Tourism & swing is a popular agrotourism attraction located in the **Tegallalang district near Ubud, Bali**. It provides visitors with a comprehensive look at traditional Balinese agriculture, coffee production, and iconic jungle photo opportunities.

Here you will be treated to a coffee tasting!!

and also have a chance to experience **Kopi Luwak!** : the world's most expensive coffee. You'll learn how this is harvested, roasted, and processed using Asian palm civets.

Tasting a freshly brewed cup of authentic Luwak coffee costs around **IDR 50,000 to IDR 65,000**



Tirta Empul Temple (Holy Spring Temple)

Tirta Empul Temple, located in Tampaksiring, Bali, is one of the island's most revered Hindu temples and a significant spiritual destination.

This is one of Bali's most important temples, famous for its holy spring water used for purification rituals.

Dating back to 962 AD during the Warmadewa dynasty, the temple is dedicated to Vishnu, the god of water, and is celebrated for its sacred spring, which has drawn worshippers for centuries seeking spiritual cleansing and renewal.

Optional activity:

- If you would like, you may also participate in the purification ritual (this is optional, not required). Our driver will explain how it works.

The Melukat Ceremony

The [Melukat Ceremony at Tirta Empul](#) Temple is a unique Balinese purification ritual that utilizes holy water to cleanse the body, mind, and spirit of negative energies, promoting inner peace and balance. This deeply spiritual practice is essential for many Balinese Hindus, as it embodies the desire for renewal and healing.

Activities here include:

- Walking around the temple complex
- Seeing the holy spring pools
- Watching locals perform purification rituals
- Taking photos

Pura Gunung Kawi - Cliff Temple Complex

Pura Gunung Kawi —also widely known as **Candi Tebing Gunung Kawi**—is an extraordinary 11th-century cliff temple complex located in **Tampaksiring, Gianyar Regency, Bali**.

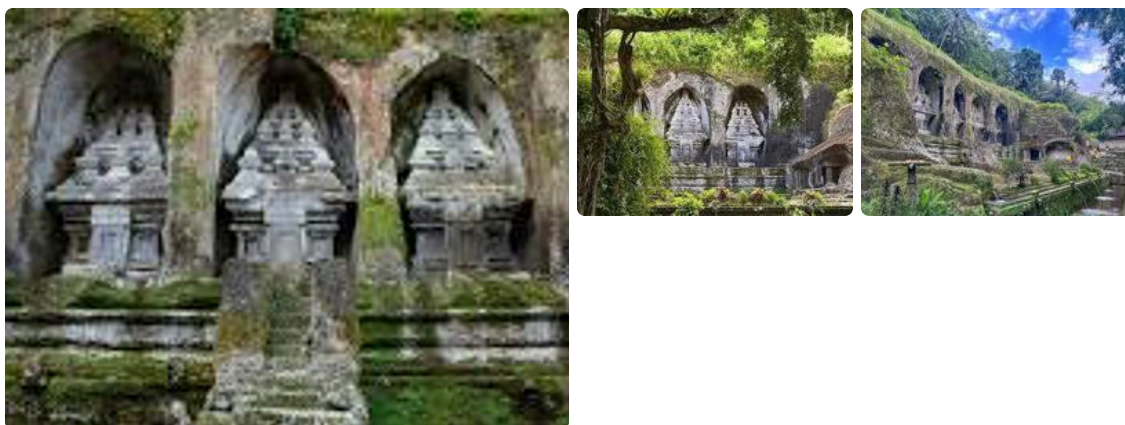
Walking down to **Pura Gunung Kawi** involves navigating a scenic but long but easy stone staircase of **around 300 steps** that cuts through the cliffside. The walkway is filled with merchants and a great Cafe overlooking the area as a mid-way stop.

It is an easy walk if you take your time, with flat landings every 20 steps, and shopping along the way to rest at! The path winds down into a lush river valley, passing terraced rice fields, dense jungle greenery, and local artisan stalls. Well worth the effort - the complex at the river's end it is quite an experience!

Positioned along the sacred **Pakerisan River valley**, the site is most famous for its 10 towering *candi* (shrines) carved directly into the sheer face of a stone cliff.

The name itself translates directly to **"Sculpted Mountain"** (*Gunung* meaning mountain, and *Kawi* meaning carving or poetry).

While shaped like burial towers, the shrines are not actual tombs containing physical remains. Instead, they were constructed as **royal memorials and cenotaphs** dedicated to honoring the deified spirits of the Warmadewa royal family.

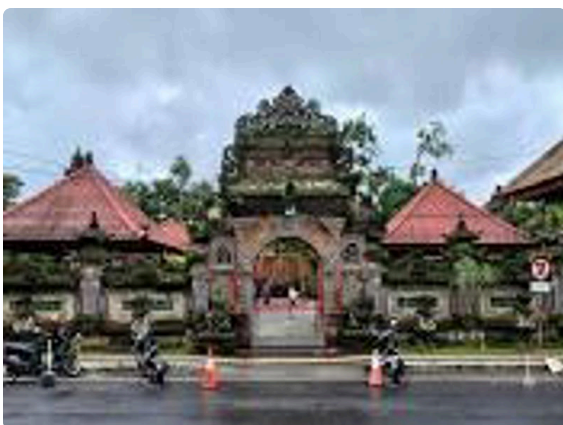
Ubud Palace

The Ubud Palace, officially known as [Puri Saren Agung](#), was built in the early 19th century during the reign of **Tjokorda Putu Kandel (1800–1823)**. Located in the heart of Ubud, Bali, it served as the official seat of power and government for the ruling [Sukawati Dynasty](#). Today, it remains a central cultural landmark and a primary residence for descendants of the royal family.

The Royal Palace is home to the current **King Tjokorde Raka Kerthyasa whose ties go back to the Majapahit Empire, and his wife Princess Jero Asri Kerthyasa**, their three children and grandchildren play an important role in Ubud. The King is extremely active in the community and government.

Officially, **there is no royal family in Indonesia** and that means the Ubud King is not an official title. However, there is an Ubud King, King Sukawati. His Royal Highness's Balinese Title is Tjokorda Putra Sukawati. Tjokorda has a meaning closer to "prince" than "king".

Note: Best to visit this first thing in the morning, as it does get quite busy in the afternoon.



Goa Gajah (Elephant Cave Temple)

Goa Gajah, or the Elephant Cave, is an ancient sanctuary and meditation complex located in Bedulu Village near Ubud, Bali.

Dating back to the 11th century, the site features striking stone carvings and showcases a unique historical blend of both Hindu and Buddhist spiritual influences.

Despite the moniker "Elephant Cave," there have never been elephants in the area. The name likely derives from the cave's proximity to the Petanu River (formerly known as the Elephant River or *Air Gajah*). Another theory is that it was named after the statue of the elephant-headed Hindu god, Ganesha, found inside.

The site is a rare, tangible record of the coexistence of Balinese Hinduism and Buddhism. The cave itself contains a Ganesha statue alongside Hindu *lingam* and *yoni* symbols, while the nearby river ruins feature Buddhist *stupa* and *chattra* carvings.



Ubud Art Villages Tour

Ubud Art Villages (Tohpati, Celuk, Batuan, Mas)

These villages around Ubud are famous for traditional Balinese arts and handicrafts. This is not just sightseeing—you will also see how local artisans work.

This part of the tour is relaxed and cultural, with short drives, and short stops in each village.

- **Tohpati Village (Batik):** You will visit a batik workshop where you can see how traditional batik fabric is handmade using wax and dye techniques. The staff will explain the process, and you can also browse or purchase handmade items if you wish.
- **Celuk Village (Silver & Gold):** This village is known for silver and gold jewelry. You will visit a workshop to see local craftsmen creating jewelry by hand. You can observe the process and visit the showroom.
- **Batuan Village (Painting & Traditional House):** Here you will visit an art gallery and a traditional Balinese house compound. You will see traditional paintings and learn about Balinese family compound structure and culture.
- **Mas Village (Wood Carving):** This village is famous for wood carving. You will visit a workshop where artisans create detailed carvings. You can watch the carving process and see many finished artworks.

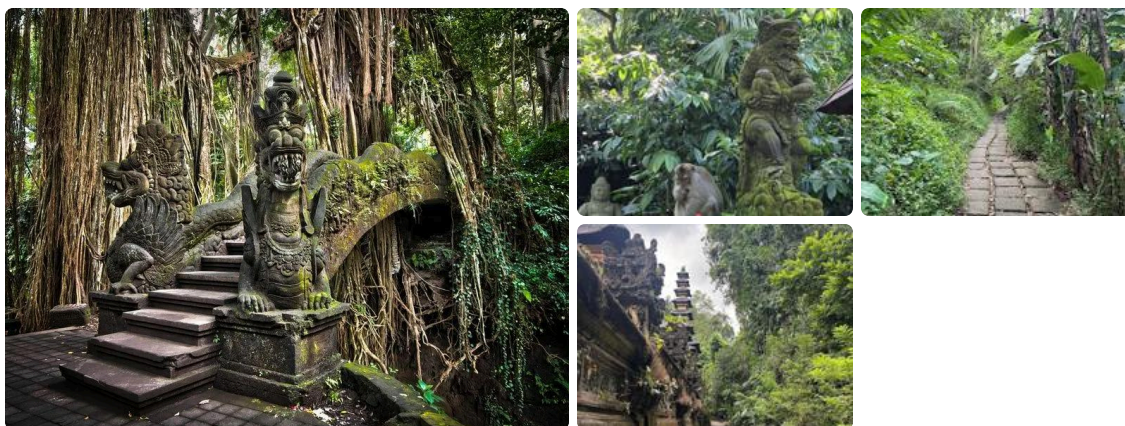

Tegenungan Waterfall

Komodo National Park

Komodo National Park includes the three larger islands Komodo, Padar and Rinca, and 26 smaller ones. The national park was founded in 1980 to protect the Komodo dragon, the world's largest lizard, and later other marine animals. In 1991 the national park was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Komodo National Park has been selected as one of the New 7 Wonders of Nature. The waters surrounding Komodo island contain rich marine biodiversity.

The islands in the park also a part of the Coral Triangle, which contains some of the richest marine biodiversity on Earth.



Komodo Island Day Tour with Snorkeling FULL DAY TOUR

Floating Temples: Tanah Lot & Batu Bolong

Pura Tanah Lot is an iconic Balinese Hindu sea temple located in the Tabanan Regency, about 20 km northwest of Kuta.

Perched on a dramatic offshore rock formation, it is renowned for its stunning sunset backdrops and is deeply significant as one of Bali's seven sea temples built to protect the island.

You cannot go inside the actual inner sanctum of Tanah Lot Temple, as this sacred area is strictly reserved for Balinese Hindus to pray.

Assessible only at low tide for prayer, it becomes an island at high tide and completely inaccessible.

Check the tide table, and for a quiet photogenic moment - go EARLY in the morning - be there by 8:30am.

As it get quite crowded after 10am.

Sunset is breathtaking - but scores of people!!

It is a huge complex - with LOTS of shopping available.

- **Dress Code:** Because it is an active, sacred place of worship, modest attire covering your shoulders and knees is required. Sarongs can be rented at the entrance.
- **Local Myths:** According to legend, the temple is protected by venomous sea snakes that reside in the caves at the base of the rock

Around the "corner" (10 minute walk) is

Pura Batu Bolong: Located just 300 meters north of Tanah Lot. It is famous for its stunning natural rock archway over the ocean, making it a spectacular (and less crowded) spot for sunset photos. [[1](#), [2](#), [3](#)]

- **Pura Enjung Galuh:** A smaller, beautifully situated sea temple that juts out onto the cliffs just before reaching the main Tanah Lot shrine.
