What to do around Queenstown Thursday & Friday... WHAT TO DO:

BIKE THE FRANKTON TRACK Not only is the Frankton Track one of the top things to do in Queenstown, but it's arguably the most beautiful biking trail in New Zealand!

What makes it so enjoyable is that it's great for all skill levels.

The mostly flat pathway goes from Queenstown to Frankton and then out on the Peninsula Track. Get a full day bike rental so you can take your time swimming, grabbing lunch, and even a local craft beer while you cruise along the lake. <u>Renting a bicycle in Queenstown</u> costs only about \$35 USD for a half day and \$55 USD for the full day. With a bike, you can explore many of the different cycling trails around Queenstown.

HIRE an ATV and get MUDDY There's nothing quite like going on an epic off-roading experience, and Queenstown, the adventure capital of the world, of course, has the perfect way to do it.

If you love driving fast, getting dirty and admiring world-class views, then make sure you sign up for a 3.5-hour ATV ride outside of town.

STROLL IN THE QUEENSTOWN GARDENS

The Queenstown Gardens are the perfect spot for an afternoon stroll and are located a short walk from the town beach. Take the path that goes along the waters edge then cut up to admire the colorful flowers and trees.

SHOP AT THE QUEENSTOWN MALL Queenstown Mall is actually a pedestrian only walking street in the center of town that cuts down to the water. So you can pass through here easily on your way to more fun Queenstown fun.

CRUISE Lake Wakatipu TSS Earnslaw Cruise

Take a ride on the old fashion Steamship to the end of the lake and do the Farm Tour.

You can ride both ways (4 hrs each way), or ride over and fly back (plane or heli), or fly both ways. Your choice. Price varies greatly.

CHEAP GREAT PLACES TO EAT & DRINK:

Bakery on Shotover Street

Stop by for a Meat Pie for take-away. Chicken & Mushroom. Steak & Onion. Lamb & Mint. There are so many choices... New Zealand is famous for them - and they are delicious and inexpensive!

Fergburger - One of the most popular things to do in Queenstown is to <u>eat at Fergburger</u>! In fact, Fergburger CLAIMS TO BE the best burger in Queenstown.

You would think that a place like this would be expensive, but it isn't! A Classic Fergburger will only cost you \$17 NZD (\$11 usd)

1876 - One pub, in particular, that is famous among locals for cheap drinks is called <u>1876</u>. During Happy Hour, they offer \$5 NZD tap beer or cider as well as the house wine. They also have great HH food specials! Big outdoor patio. Live music - Wednesday thru Sunday

THE COW -Spaghetti, Pizza, Homemade Soup & Bread, Salad, & more...

The Cow has been operating from its historic premises since 1977, making it Queenstown's oldest continuously operating restaurant. Situated in Cow Lane, the stone barn housed cows which used to wander down the lane for daily milking. Great atmosphere.

Spaghetti and/or Pizza - \$28 - \$30NZD (\$16 - 18usd)

??? PUB CRAWL - typically meet in town and then walk to 3-4 different pubs/clubs around Queenstown as a group led by a guide. At each location, there are often organized games or free shots. And since you'll be hanging with the same group of people all night, you're sure to make some friends and have a few laughs.

The names of the companies in town that do the pub crawls are *Big Night Out*, and *Kiwi Crawl*. The regular price is about \$25 NZD per person (\$17 USD) and you can book this pub crawl that comes with 5 shots and pizza here!



Visit Arrowtown

Arrowtown is built on the banks of the Arrow River, once a rich source of gold. In 1862, thousands of miners from around the world flocked to Arrowtown to make their fortune. The miners moved on, but their legacy has become a treasure in its own right.

Arrowtown is recognised as <u>Tohu Whenua</u> – a place that has shaped the nation and one of New Zealand's best heritage experiences.

Stroll down to the Chinese Village for a glimpse into life for early miners, then try your hand at gold panning.

Arrowtown's Chinese Settlement is a mute reminder and tribute to the contribution made by Chinese goldminers and business people to the region's gold mining, cultural and business history.

Many of the huts have been restored, offering visitors the chance to step back into that 'golden' era and see up-close the toil and modest living conditions of the 'other half' in this prosperous town.

Extensive interpretation panels in both English and Chinese tell the story of the Chinese gold miners in the area. You can read about who the miners were and about the challenges and rewards of everyday life in the settlement.

9:30am - 12:30 with stop at Bungy Bridge

Grade 2 – Easy 13.7 km pedal one way (8.5 miles - about an 1.5 hours of gentle pedaling). Take your time and stop often.

We don't need to be at the Winery until 12:30 for our [optional] lunch reservation.

Today enjoy an independent cycling trip experiencing the best that Queenstown has to offer.

Your journey starts down by Dudley's Cottage and the Arrowtown Chinese Settlement on the 'true right' of the lovely willowlined Arrow River - the home of the gold rush in the 1800s and is steeped in history.

The trail heads west along the banks of the Arrow River, a river of many moods, sometimes tranquil, often rushing over rocks and bluffs, then widening to limpid pools. There's no shortage of photo ops at each bridge. One of the most popular photo stops is midway across the awe-inspiring Southern Discoveries suspension bridge. A destination in itself and what a view!

Across the bridge, you'll ride past quaint cottages and grazing horses down Whitechapel country lane – a landscape painting straight out of a picture book. Stop at the Knights Family Underbridge and take in the spectacular downstream view of where the Arrow River drops into the gorge.

Yet another impressive feat of engineering, the graceful 80-metre Edgar Suspension Bridge is guaranteed to deliver gasps of appreciation at the views from its midpoint down into the Arrow Gorge. Once you've crossed the Edgar Bridge, be sure to stop at the Wall of Recognition and offer up a 'thanks' to the landowners and Queenstown community who had the vision to help make the Queenstown Trail a reality.

Getting across busy State Highway 6 is a piece of cake via the Barfoot Tunnel - and onto a part of the trail which follows the original goldminers' road into Queenstown. Breathe in the thyme-scented mountain air as you make your way over the historic Kawarau Suspension Bridge, home to the world's first commercial bungy jumping operation. The AJ Hackett Bungy Centre is a stunning piece of architecture, well worth a visit – and has a good café, toilets and of course tickets for that bungy jump you've been promising yourself. On the Bungy viewing deck there are many informative panels about the history of the area that are well worth a read.

9:30 - 10a Nothing you have experienced will have you prepared for the thrill and excitement of a **Shotover Jet ride**; it's an adrenaline rush you'll never forget!

YOU WILL GET A RAIN SLICKER, and life vest. You probably won't get too wet, but bring water shoes if you brought them, or a change of shirt perhaps (just in case).

From the moment the accelerator hits the floor your adrenaline hits the roof as you speed in mere centimeters of water along the famous Shotover River and deep into the spectacular Shotover River Canyons.

It's an amazing ride, as the Shotover Canyon walls tower over you, your expert driver puts your 'Big Red' through its paces and skillfully whips the Jet Boat past rocky outcrops, skims around crags and boulders, and speeds through the narrow canyons. Rock faces blur in your peripheral vision, the opaque water sprays into myriads of white crystals with every turn, and you grip the hand rail for comfort and reassurance and then let out a whoop of excitement as your driver spins the boat around in its own boat length — wow, you've just experienced the World famous Shotover Jet full 360 degree spin. Hold on tight and enjoy the thrill as you spin and without losing momentum keep speeding along the river. The best thing of all... this is actually good for you. Studies have shown a good thrill livens up your system, waking up dormant biochemical pathways that refresh, relieve stress and heal. You experience a sense of euphoria and well being as your brain receives a welcome cocktail of oxygen, sugar, adrenaline, cortisol and endorphins. The result — a natural high that makes you feel great!

From Wanaka travel north between Lake Wanaka and Lake Hawea through the Mt Aspiring National Park and Haast Pass to Haast on the West Coast. Through the dramatic gorges of the Haast Pass there are bushwalks signposted from the road, the most popular being to the '**Blue Pools**', which we will have a stop at.

A possible stop for lunch can be **Hard Antler Bar and Restaurant** on Marks Road in Haast (ph: +64 3-750 0034). We have a reserved table for lunch (our own expense) at 11:30am or 12pm.

From Haast hug the West Coast north, passing Lake Moeraki and the **penguins at Munroe Beach**, to the Glaciers of Fox and Franz Josef.

After you check into your resort and the sun goes down, **grab your torch and head off for a Glow Worm walk**. You may not think of glow worms and glaciers together in the same location, but there are many spots around the Fox and Franz Josef Glacier area where you will find these little creatures. One of the easiest spots to see glow worms when staying in **Franz Josef Glacier is along The Terrace Walk**, located just off State Highway 6 near the Westland Visitor Centre. Look for glow worms around or under large fallen trees.

12:30 Hokitika Westcoast Treetop Walk

An exhilarating treetop adventure among temperate rainforest giants, experience life with the birds, high in the ancient Rimu and Kamahi tree canopy.

Thrill seekers will feel their hearts pump and the adrenalin rush as they climb to the top of Hokitika Tower 40 metres above the forest floor. Easy access for all to enjoy along a steel platform 20 metres high and over 450 metres long.

A short walk leads to the cave entrances high above the Nile River. You will enter a hidden subterranean world leaving the daylight behind to explore a calcite paradise of stalactites and stalagmites, cross huge chambers, follow a maze of passages and wander through the heart of an ancient multi-leveled cave system. Marine Reserve Kayak Day Trip

Abel Tasman National Park's rocky coastline is a haven for a myriad of marine life and is always a fascinating place to explore. Abel Tasman Kayaks is one of only three operators authorized to undertake marine mammal viewing from sea kayaks at Tonga Island Marine Reserve, which is where you will go today. This is a stunning trip where the start and finish points of the kayaking section are around the tide timetable, offering the best part of the park to explore the marine reserve to the fullest.

Seals & Remote Coast Guided Kayak Day Trip

This morning you will be transferred by water taxi to start an amazing adventure by Kayak!

Please make your way on foot to the top of the beach and report with Abel Tasman Kayaks (ph: +64 3 527 8022) at 1 Kaiteriteri-Sandy Bay Road in front of The Waterfront Restaurant in Kaiteriteri at 8:45am where you will board the water taxi to take you to your Remote Coast Kayak Trip and return you in the same spot at the end of the day. Your day starts with a water taxi transfer to Awaroa where you get into your kayak. Visit Shag Harbour, a hidden inlet like nowhere else in the Abel Tasman. You will then paddle south, focusing on the Tonga Island Marine Reserve and its playful inhabitants - the NZ fur seal, Kekeno. After a great picnic lunch on one of the seven beautiful beaches you will paddle past delightful rock sculptures and peaceful lagoons to your final destination at Bark Bay Beach. Water taxi back to Marahau.

The best thing about this trip is that you see plenty of seals and very few fellow kayakers - hence the name of trip.

At NOON - this is where you will board the Sea Shuttle for a return back to Kaiteriteri. Look for the black and white post - this is where the boat stops (there is NO dock).

You must have purchased your tix beforehand. \$36 nzd The ticket office is next to the Waterfront Restaurant and closes at 5:30p.

LONGER TREK - continue from Apple Tree Bay to Anchorage Bay (another 2.5 hours) Continuing from Apple Tree Bay, then passes through beech forest with large kānuka trees. After Yellow Point it turns inland, winding in and out of several little gullies before emerging in open country overlooking Rākauroa/ Torrent Bay and the coast and islands to the north. Descend to the beautiful Anchorage Bay where there is a hut and campsite. Choose your return tix to come back either at 1:45 or 3:45. Anchorage Bay is where you will board the Sea Shuttle for a return back to Kaiteriteri. Look for the black and white post - this is where the boat stops (there is NO dock).

Kaiteriteri to Stephens Bay Walk

5 km - out & back (3.5 miles)

This is a beautiful coastal walk with stunning views and beaches along the way. It starts from Kaiteriteri and takes you via Kaiteriteri Lookout, Little Kaiteriteri Beach, Dummy Bay to Stephens Bay Beach. You can return via the same track or create a loop by walking along Stephens Bay Road and Riwaka - Kaiteriteri Road.

Enjoy this 5.0-km out-and-back trail near Motueka, Nelson-Tasman. Generally considered an easy route, it takes an average of 1 h 12 min to complete. This trail is great for camping, hiking, and walking, and it's unlikely you'll encounter many other people while exploring.

Te Puia Guided Tour, Evening Maori Cultural Experience

10:15am You will leave for Te Puia Village located on Hemo Road in Rotorua for a guided tour.

You are booked for the 11:00am guided 90min tour. Please report at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the tour. You will be transferred back to your accommodation or into town after the tour for free time to have a late lunch. Your Driver will be available this afternoon for transfers/sightseeing, if required.

Te Puia –is New Zealand's premier Maori Cultural and Geothermal Centre. Te Puia has a long history of delivering unique experiences to visitors from all over the world. This history, while short in a cultural, environmental and historic context is long in terms of its recognition as a tourism visitor attraction.

Te Whakarewarewa is New Zealand's best known thermal area and contains a tremendous variety of geothermal activity. There are more than 500 springs in the reserve which vary from cold to boiling cauldrons.

Much of the water, that is released by the geysers and the clear boiling pools have a high silica content and as it flows over the nearby rocky ground, it leaves a deposit which builds up impressive and sometimes colourful terraces.

Most famous of all is the Pohutu Geyser. Nestled in the geothermal valley of Whakarewarewa, Pohutu Geyser bursts into life up to 20 times each day, shooting boiling water up to 30 metres (90 feet) skyward.

Also on display throughout the valley are steaming cauldrons of mud – varying in temperature, purpose, size and colour, these pools each hold significance and place in the day to day lives of local Maori. Visitors to Te Puia will see carvers at work (both students and masters) and also the weavers expertly transforming simple strands of flax into intricate pieces of art.

Performances of traditional and contemporary dancing are also a daily feature.

Maori guides share their heritage, pride and values that have been handed down through the generations. The Kiwi bird has been at home in New Zealand for over 70 million years. Te Puia is fortunate to have these native New Zealand icons available for visitors to view in the specially designed Kiwi house. Te Puia also partakes in a national breeding programme.

About the 7:30 TREEWALK:

MEET AT THE TREEWALK ENTRANCE AT 7:20

The Redwoods Treewalk is located 12-metres above the forest floor and constructed to traverse between 22 majestic 115year old Redwood trees and existing plants, allowing them to remain untouched in their natural state.

The Redwood Forest is made up of both Californian Coastal Redwoods and Douglas Fir.

The tree platforms and bridges are suspended using a technologically designed sling suspended from the redwood trees. The sling can hold up to five tonnes in weight and allows these 115-year-old giants to grow at their natural rate and remain undamaged.

The night-time walk is a unique Kiwi design-led tourism experience found nowhere else in the world and encompasses 30 lanterns designed by the world-acclaimed designer and sustainability champion, David Trubridge.

In addition to the Trubridge lighting, over forty infinite colour spots and feature lights illuminate the 115-year-old redwood trees, forest ferns and pungas.

The lanterns are up to 2.5 meters tall and were made at the David Trubridge workshop in Hastings and assembled by a team in the forest by hand, taking care not to damage the forest environment.

The Aratiatia Rapids are also accessible on an alternative route through to Taupo via Spa Road passing the Taupo Golf Club.



Information & Documents

You need an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) to enter New Zeland

Starting **October 1, 2019**, U.S. citizens along with citizens of other countries who have a visa waiver agreement with New Zealand will need to obtain an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) before entering the country.

The fastest way to request your NZeTA is by downloading our free app to your mobile phone. If you use the app it will take you less than 5 minutes to complete your request.

You can use the app to scan your passport to instantly upload your details and scan your credit or debit card for ease of payment.

Download the free app now from the link above.

Cost and processing time

An NZeTA request costs NZD \$17 on our free app, or NZD \$23 if completed online.

Allow 72 hours for your NZeTA request to be processed.

Many requests will be processed more quickly.

You need:

-a valid passport that you will use to travel to New Zealand

-a credit card or debit card (Visa or Mastercard)

-an email address

-a photo of your face, or a device that can take one.

The IVL

If you are entering New Zealand **you must also pay an IVL**, which funds tourism infrastructure and helps protect our natural environment.

You pay the IVL at the same time as you request your NZeTA. The IVL costs NZD \$35.

Arrival into New Zealand

Before departing the plane, you will be given an Entry Form to fill out.

Please note that New Zealand takes VERY SERIOUSLY the entry rules - especially that NO fruits, vegetables, animal products are brought in. NOTHING. So clear out your travel bag of any snacks you've brought for the plane. Throw away ALL fruit.

Make sure that you state that you have NOT been to a Farm.

Weather in New Zealand in March

March is the first month of autumn in New Zealand, but summery conditions tend to linger, and in many parts of the country March is almost as warm and sunny as February. The further south you go, however, the more autumnal the weather, with leaves on the trees turning orange.

Average March high temperatures are in the **high 60s F** (around 19-21° C) in the upper **North Island**, the low 60s F (17° C) in central parts of the country, including **Wellington** and the upper **South Island** - like Able Tasman National Park area.

And **high 50s F** (15° C) further south, including **Queenstown** and **Dunedin**. Mountainous and inland areas will generally be colder than coastal places, and it's not unusual to see a sprinkling of snow on the mountains in places like **Queenstown** and **Wanaka** in March.

New Zealand summers are generally quite dry, but rain increases from March. New Zealand gets a lot of rain throughout the year, **but March isn't a very wet month**. But bring your rain slicker, just in case.

PASSPORT

Due to airline security measures, **your passport name must match your airline ticket name** or you may be denied boarding. Your **passport's expiration date must be at least six months after your return** from your trip; if it is not, you should renew your passport.

It is your responsibility to ensure the validity of all travel documents! We recommend that you make copies of your important documents and papers (insurance cards, etc.). Leave a copy at home and have a copy with you. In the unfortunate situation that you lose your original documents, having copies facilitates the replacement process.

For US citizens, the <u>US Department of State</u> website is a good source of information. The *Country Information* tab in the International Travel section provides details about passport validity, blank passport pages required, etc.
